DESIGN FOR COFFIN-PLATES.

Specification forming part of Design No. **8,995**, dated February 15, 1876; application filed January 17, 1876.
[Term of Patent 14 years.]

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, WILLIAM C. BEATTIE, of Taunton, in the county of Bristol and State of Massachusetts, have invented a Design for a Coffin-Plate, of which the following is a description:

The design, which is represented in plan in the accompanying drawing, consists, first, of an inscription-plate, A, having the form of a leaf; and, secondly, of a leaf, B, which is arranged transversely of the leaf A. Both are represented as connected by the same stem, and buds, flowers, and small leaves are joined to the leaf B, as shown.

What I claim is—

1. The design, consisting of the leaf B and flowers connected therewith, as shown.
2. The design for a coffin-plate, consisting of leaf A, as shown and described.
3. The design, consisting of the leaf-shaped parts A B, as shown and described.
