

DESIGN FOR CASSIMERES.

Specification forming part of Design No. 8,996, dated February 15, 1876; application filed January 3, 1876. [Term of Patent 3½ years.]

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, EDWARD C. CLARK, of Rockville, in the county of Tolland and State of Connecticut, have originated and designed a Pattern for Cassimeres, or other fabrics for wearing-apparel, of which the following is a

full, clear, and exact description:
The nature of my design is fully represented in the accompanying photographic illustra-

tion, to which reference is made.

The fabric represented in the drawing has a ground composed of stripes a b, of contrasting shades, each stripe being, preferably, mottled or striped—one longitudinally and the other adjacent one transversely-and on this ground, and in the stripes, I weave the word "CENTENNIAL," the letters of the word

running longitudinally and forming parallel

I have shown a plain letter; but it is evident I could change the style of the letter, and so, too, I can add transverse bars between the letters, forming the ground into squares.

The design consists in the letters "CEN-TENNIAL," inwrought into the face of a striped fabric, with a contrasting color.

I claim—
The design for cassimeres, substantially as described.
