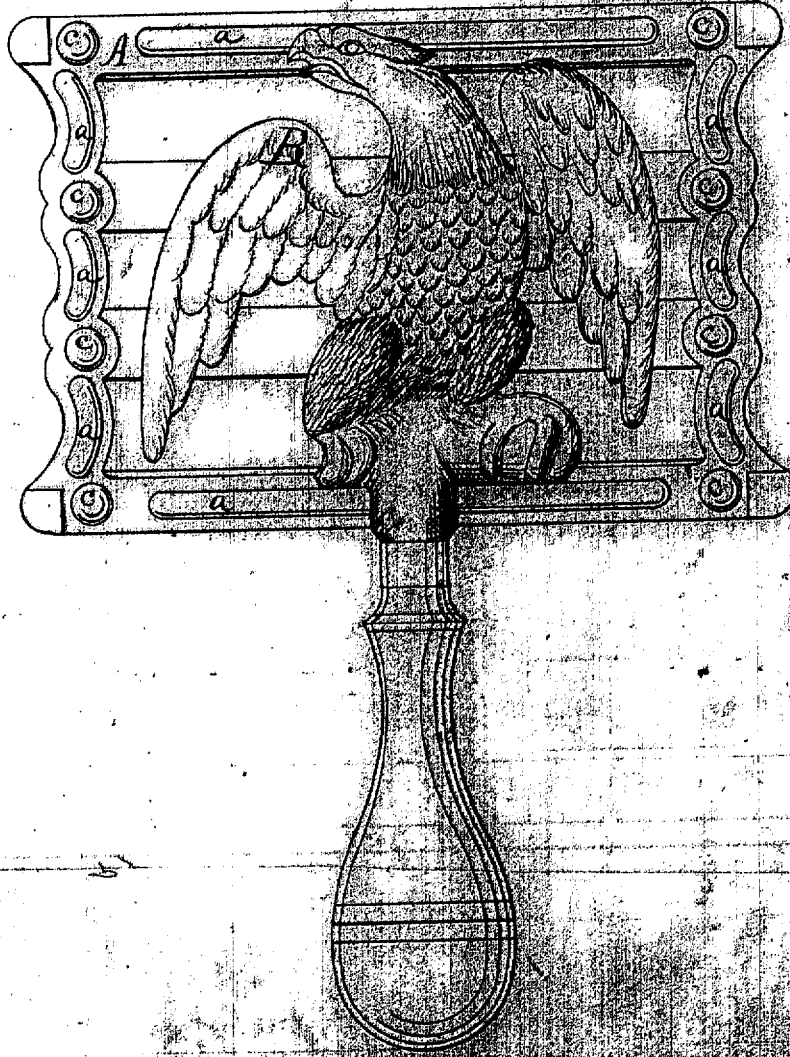

## DESIGN FOR CURRY-COMB FRAMES.

Specification forming part of Design No. **9,003**, dated February 15, 1876; application filed January 24, 1876.  
[Term of Patent 14 years.]

*To all whom it may concern :*

Be it known that I, FRANK B. BRADLEY, of Southington, in the county of Hartford and State of Connecticut, have invented and produced a new and original Design for a Curry-Comb Frame, of which the following is a full, clear, and exact description, reference being had to the accompanying drawing, making part of this specification.

The nature of my design is fully represented in the accompanying drawing, to which reference is made.

A represents the main portion of the frame of a curry-comb, which may be of any desired contour. Upon the top of this portion of the frame I form a rounded ledge, *a*, and at each corner and over the ends of each double row of teeth I form a rounded cap, *c*, all as shown, at which points the ledge *a* is broken.

In the size of comb-frame shown in the drawing there are four caps upon each end of the frame, and in the smaller size there are only three such caps at each end.

B designates the interior portion of the frame, which is in the form of an eagle, the feet and head of which are joined to the other portion of the frame.

I prefer to make the frames all with the ledge and caps, but the interior portion of the frame, which constitutes the most important feature of my design, may, if desired, be used in connection with any other style of main frame.

What I claim as my invention is—

1. A design for a curry-comb frame, consisting essentially of the representation of an eagle, substantially as shown and described.

2. A design for a curry-comb frame, consisting of a representation of an eagle for the interior portion of the frame and the main frame, as shown, ornamented by rounded ledges and caps, in the manner described.
