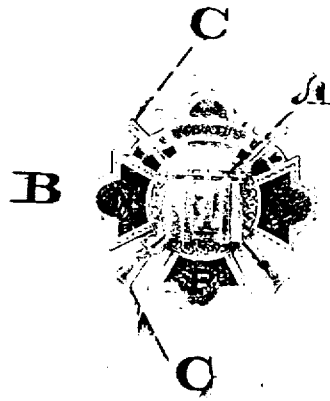

DESIGN FOR A BADGE.

Specification forming part of Design No. 9,004, dated February 15, 1876; application filed January 31, 1876.
[Term of Patent 3½ years.]

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, SELAH H. CLARK, of the city and county of Philadelphia and State of Pennsylvania, have originated and designed a new and useful Design for Military Badge, of which the following is a full, clear, and exact description, reference being had to the accompanying photographic illustration, in which—

A knapsack, A, projects from the face of a cross-shaped figure, B, and muskets C cross each other, and their muzzles and butts occupy the intervening spaces of the limbs of the cross-shaped figure B. The number of the

company, name of the member, or other characteristic of the organization of the regiment or command, may be engraved or otherwise attached to the badge.

What I claim as my invention is—

The design for a badge consisting of the knapsack A, cross-shaped figure B, and crossed muskets C, substantially as above set forth, and shown in the accompanying drawings.
