

DESIGN FOR FLOWER-STANDS.

Specification forming part of Design No. 9,007, dated February 15, 1876; application filed February 9, 1876.

[Term of Patent 7 years.]

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, RUSSEL R. LEWIS, of De Ruyter, in the county of Madison and State of New York, have originated and designed a Flower-Stand, of which the following is a specification:

The nature of my design is fully represented in the accompanying photographic illustra-

tion, to which reference is made.

A represents an ornamental turned standard, supported by four ornamental bracket-feet, B, radiating from a band, C, in which the lower end of the standard is inserted. Three similar bands, C', are sleeved upon the standard, one above the other, at places of suitable diameter turned on the standard to receive them. From each band radiate five bracket-

arms, B', of the same ornamental pattern as those which form the feet of the standard, except that each has an eye in the extremity to receive a stud, d, pendent from the center of a flower-pot holder, D, with one of which the standard is also surmounted. The potholders may be rotated in their supportingarms, and the bands C' are made to rotate upon the central standard, which is of wood, while all the rest is made of east-iron.

What I claim as my invention is-

The design for a flower-stand or jardiniere, substantially as represented and described.
