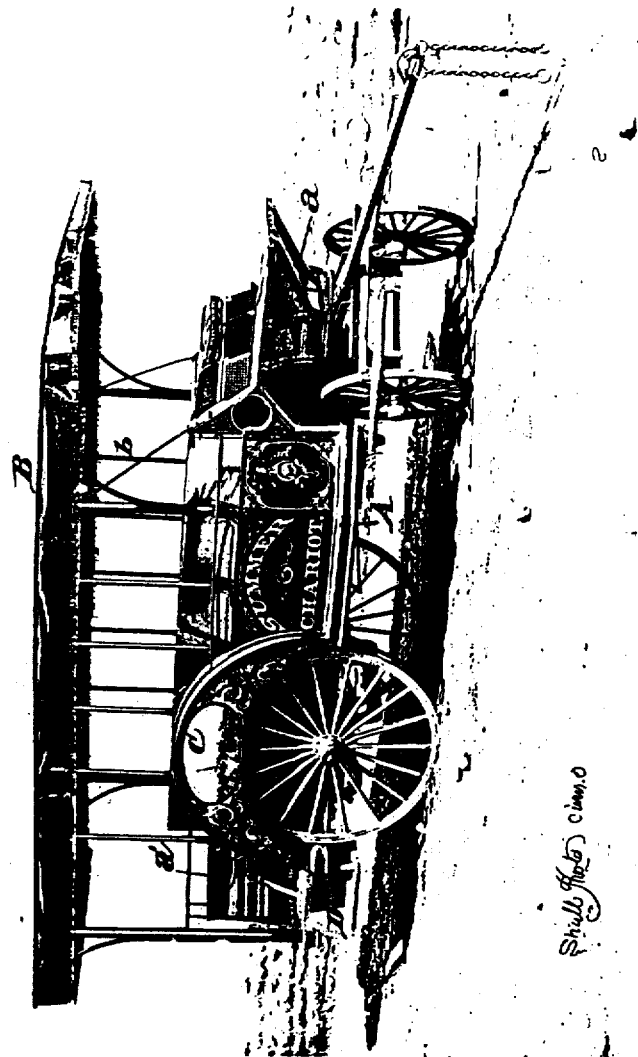

DESIGN FOR SUMMER CHARIOT.

Specification forming part of Design No. 9,009, dated February 15, 1876; application filed August 13, 1875.
[Term of Patent 7 years.]

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, CHAUNCEY M. MURCH, of Cincinnati, Hamilton county, State of Ohio, have invented a Design for Summer Passenger-Vehicles, of which the following is a specification:

The nature of my design is fully represented in the accompanying photographic illustration, to which reference is made.

The body A, which hangs low on the trucks, has side entrances at the rear and a bracket-frame, *a*, at the front of the form, clearly shown. The large hind wheels are covered on their upper side by crescent-shaped shields C. The body A is surmounted by a canopy,

B, supported above it, at a suitable distance, by standards or columns *b*.

What I claim as my invention, and desire to secure by Letters Patent, is—

The described design for a summer chariot, possessing the distinguishing characteristics of a low body, A, with bracket-frame *a* and shields C, and a canopy, B.
