DESIGN FOR BARBER AND DENTAL CHAIRS.

Specification forming part of Design No. 9,010, dated February 22, 1876; application filed December 10, 1875.

[Term of Patent 7 years.]

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, GEORGE W. ARCHER, of the city of Rochester, in the county of Monroe and State of New York, have invented or produced a new and original Design for Barber and Dental Chairs; and I do hereby declare that the following is a full, clear, and exact description of the same, reference being had to the accompanying photographic illustration, which represents the chair in perspective.

This design relates especially to the seat and back of the chair; and consists, essentially, in making the rectangular back narrower than the body or seat, and in forming the upper corners of the back in rounded form, and the bottom of the same, where it merges with the seat, also of rounded form, but at right angles to the upper corners, as hereinafter set forth.

a represents the seat of the chair, and b the back. The seat is made wider than the back, and the latter is of rectangular form, as shown. The upper corners c c of the back are rounded, as shown, and the lower corners d d, where they merge with the seat, are also rounded, but at right angles to the upper corners. The

arms of the chair, where they join the back, are also curved or concave, as shown.

This form leaves the ordinary size of the seat, but reduces the size of the back, the narrowing of which presents a more pleasing appearance to the eye than in ordinary chairs, which are made with the seat and back substantially of the same width. The rounding of the corners $c\,d$ also improves the shape over ordinary chairs, which, with wide backs, have square, or nearly square, corners at the bottom.

What I claim as new is-

The design for a barber or dental chair, consisting of a wide seat and narrow rectangular back, with rounded corners c at the top of the back, and rounded corners d at the bottom, merging with the seat, as herein shown and described.
