## DESIGN FOR AN EMBROIDERY-PATTERN.

Specification forming part of Design No. 9.012, dated February 22, 1876; application filed January 31, 1876. [Term of Patent 3½ years.]

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, EMIL CRISAND, of New Haven, in the county of New Haven and State of Connecticut, have invented a new Design for Embroidery-Pattern; and I do hereby declare the following, when taken in connection with the accompanying drawings, to be a full, clear, and exact description of the same, and which said drawings constitute part of this specification, and represent a face view.

This invention relates to a design for embroidery-pattern, with special reference to perforated board, the object being a delineation of the figure to be wrought on the board as a guide for the embroidery; and it consists in an unfurled American flag as the emblem, combined with a motto indicating honor to the flag. The flag in this pattern is arranged diagonally, with the words "Long may it wave" combined

therewith. The flag is the chief characteristic of this design. Other words indicative of honor or respect to the flag may be substituted for those shown, it only being essential that some motto of honor be combined with the flag.

I claim—

- 1. The design for embroidery-pattern consisting of the flag as the emblem, combined with the motto "Long may it wave," as shown and described.
- 2. The design for embroidery-pattern consisting of the representation of the flag, as shown in the accompanying illustration.
