

DESIGN FOR OIL-CLOTH,

Specification forming part of Design No. 9.016, dated February 22, 1876; application filed February 12, 1876. [Term of Patent 3½ years.]

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, JOSEPH BARRETT, of the city, county, and State of New York, have invented and produced a new and original Design for an Oil-Cloth; and I do hereby decare the following to be a specification thereof.
