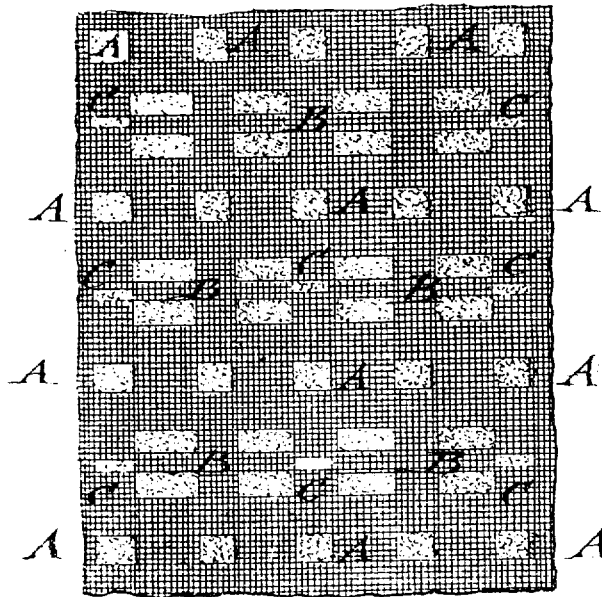

DESIGN FOR FANCY CASSIMERES.

Specification forming part of Design No. **9,018**, dated February 22, 1876; application filed February 5, 1876.
[Term of Patent 7 years.]

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, WILLIAM BÜRGER, of Utica, in the county of Oneida and State of New York, have invented a new and original Design for Fancy Cassimeres, of which the following is a specification:

The nature of my design is fully shown in the accompanying drawing, which forms part of this specification, and to which reference is herewith made.

The invention relates to a design for fancy cassimeres; and consists in the arrangement of a row of equidistant squares, alternating with double rows of equidistant oblongs, sprinkled with variously-colored silk fiber.

In the drawing, A A are squares that are arranged in rows at equal distance from each other. Between the rows of squares A are placed double rows of oblongs, B, also equidistant from each other, and arranged intermediately between the squares, so as to alter-

nate therewith. Narrow bars C connect four adjoining oblongs midway between the squares A, in every second row of the same, said squares, oblongs, and bars being interwoven with silk threads of various colors, so as to stand out in relief from the surrounding plain ground, and impart thus a uniform, yet interrupted, character to the fabric.

I claim as my invention—

The design for fancy cassimeres, produced of rows of squares, with alternating double rows of oblongs, that are connected at every second row or tier by narrow bars, the squares, oblongs, and bars being sprinkled with silk fiber, substantially as shown and described.
