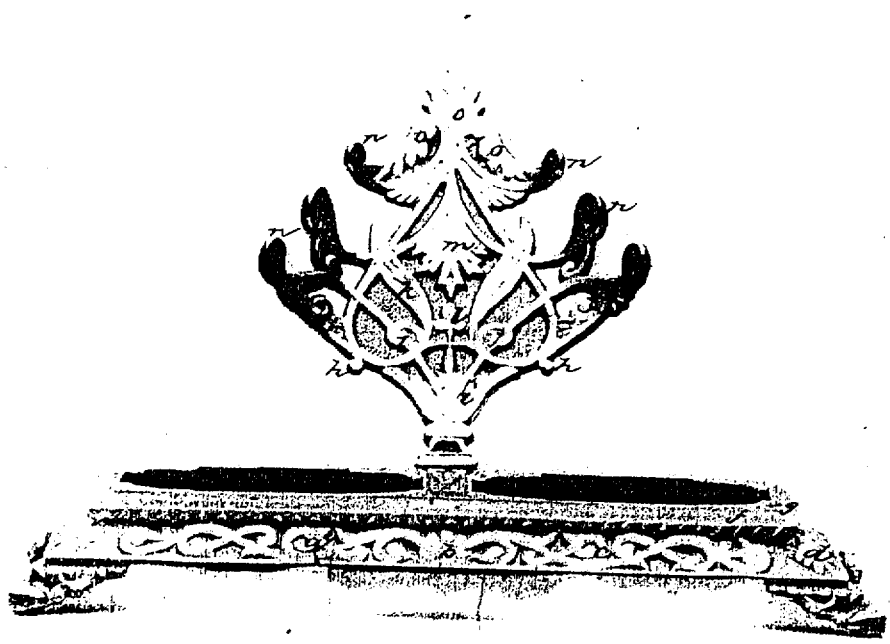

## DESIGN FOR A COMBINED INKSTAND-BASE AND PEN-RACK.

Specification forming part of Design No. **9,109**, dated February 22, 1876; application filed January 15, 1876.  
[Term of Patent 7 years.]

*To all whom it may concern:*

Be it known that we, JOSEPH KINTZ and PATRICK J. CLARK, of West Meriden, county of New Haven, and State of Connecticut, have invented a new and original Design for Combined Inkstand-Base and Pen-Rack, of which the following is a specification:

Our design for a combined inkstand-base and pen-rack, is fully represented in the accompanying photographic illustration, to which reference is made.

The base consists of a rectangular frame with slanting sides, around the bottom of which is a plain rib, *a*, and above the rib they are concave with central ornamental figures *b*, and side scroll-branches *c* on the surface, also corner ornamental figures *d*, and along the upper margin of the concave portions are fringed-shaped figures *e*. The upper corners of the frame are convex, with transverse grooves and ribs *f*, and on the top is a plain rib, *g*. The back has the plain heart-shaped rib *h* above the leaf ornaments *i*, and sur-

rounding the plate forming the body, said rib terminating in the scrolls *j*, and leaf-shaped ornaments *k*.

In the base of the heart is a cross, *l*, and in the upper part a pendant leaf, *m*. On the edges of the plate are ornamental projections *n*, and the top terminates in leaf ornaments *o*.

We claim as our invention—

1. The design for the base of an inkstand-frame, consisting of the sides with plain ribs *a* and *g*, and ornamental figures *b*, *c*, *d*, *e*, and *f*, as shown and set forth.

2. The design for the back of an inkstand-frame consisting of the plain ribs *h*, scrolls *j*, leaves *k*, cross *l*, and leaves *i* *m*, on the surface of the plate, together with the projections *n* and *o*, as shown and set forth.
