

DESIGN FOR PAPER BOXES.

Specification forming part of Design No. 9.110, dated February 29, 1876; application filed January 8, 1876 [Term of Patent 7 years.]

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, FRANK W. CHANDLER, of Brunswick, Cumberland county, Maine, have originated a Design for Paper Box, of which the following is a specification:

This design embraces the employment of a series of double lines circumscribing the box at various points, in combination with a groundwork of any suitable color or shade, with which such lines shall present a marked and pleasing contrast

The accompanying drawing, which is a perspective view of a paper box embracing my design, represents at A the body and at C the cover of the box, the covering or groundwork D of such box being, in the present instance, black. Circumscribing the bex and cover horizontally are a series of fine double lines, B B, &c., of white, or a color or tint sufficiently light to present a distinct contrast to the groundwork D. As shown in the accompanying drawing, one double line or pair of lines, B, circumscribes or traverses the upper corner of the cover C of the box, while a second double line follows the joint or point of unison of cover and box.

A single line may circumscribe the botto of the sides of the box.

I do not confine myself to the precise locality of the double lines B B, &c., as here shown, as the same may be varied without losing sight of the essential feature of my disign, which embraces the employment of a saries of double fine lines with a groundwork cany suitable color or shade. The groundwork may be light and the lines dark, or vice your and the lines may be all of the same constant to be observed in this respect being that a double lines shall present a marked and pleasing contrast to the groundwork.

Ī claim—

The herein-described design, as consisting of the groundwork or body D and the fine double lines B B, substantially as explained, and as shown in the accompanying drawing
