DESIGN FOR STREET-LANTERN.

Specification forming part of Design No. 9,117, dated February 29, 1876; application filed February 19, 1876 [Term of Patent 3½ years.]

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, FRANCIS L. PISCH, of the city, county, and State of New York, have invented a new and Improved Design for Street-Lanterns, of which the following is a specification:

The nature of my design is fully represented in the accompanying photographic illustra-

tion, to which reference is made.

A represents the band by which the lantern is secured to the post, and from which arms B project upward. The arms B curve outward, and upon their upper end is formed an ornamental band, C. From the band B the globe curves inward and outward and upward, and has a flat portion or band, D, formed around its larger part. From the band D the globe curves inward, upward, and outward, as shown in the illustration, and has an ornamental open-work band, E, formed around it. From the band E it curves inward, upward,

and inward, and is surmounted with a cylindrical part, F, having ornamental openings formed in it. The upper end of the part F is surrounded with an ornamental cornice, G, and supports a standard, H, having a wide circular base, a beaded shaft, and a basketshaped top, in which rests a globe, I. Upon the top of the globe I is an ornamental cross, J, upon which stands an eagle, K, with outspread wings.

Having thus described my invention, what I claim as new, and desire to secure by Letters Patent, is-

A design for street-lanterns, composed of the ornamental configuration herein shown and described.
