DESIGN FOR A MEDAL.

Specification forming part of Design No. **9,130**, dated March 7, 1876; application filed August 14, 1875.
[Term of Patent 3½ years.]

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, RUDOLPH J. DELANY, of the city and county of Philadelphia, and State of Pennsylvania, have originated and designed a Centennial Medal, of which the following is a full, clear, and exact description, reference being had to the accompanying photographic illustration, making part of this specification.

The nature of my design is fully represented in the accompanying photographic illustration, to which reference is made.

In the center of the face of the medal is a fac-simile of the Liberty Bell, in the State-House or Independence Hall, at Philadelphia,

Pennsylvania. Surrounding the same are thirteen stars and the words "Our Country," "The Bell that Tolloed the Tale," "July 4th, 1776."

What I claim as my invention is—

The design for Centennial medal, the same having on its face a representation of the Liberty Bell, with thirteen stars and the words "Our Country," "The Bell that Tolloed the Tale," "July 4th, 1776," as shown and described in the accompanying drawing.
