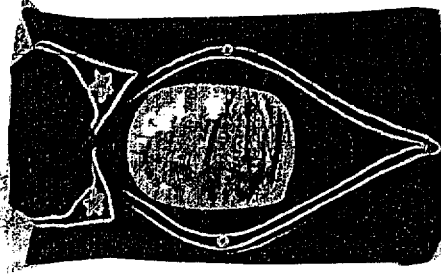
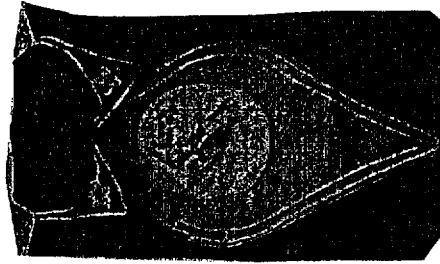

DESIGN FOR REVERSIBLE SHIRT-BOSOMS.

Specification forming part of Design No. 9,134, dated March 14, 1876; application filed February 23, 1876.
[Term of Patent $3\frac{1}{4}$ years.]

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, SAMUEL COHN, of the city of New York, county and State of New York, have invented a Design for Reversible Shirt-Fronts, of which the following is a specification:

The nature of my design is fully represented in the accompanying illustration, to which reference is made.

Figure 1 represents one side of a reversible shirt-front, upon which, as shown, is a likeness of General Washington. The reverse side is shown in Fig. 2, upon which, as shown, is a representation of Independence Hall, in Philadelphia. The ground upon which these representations are placed may be of any de-

sired color, each side being similar or different solid colors, or one or both may be part-colored.

Having thus described my invention, what I claim as new is—

The design for a reversible shirt-front, having on one face a likeness of General Washington, and on the other face a representation of Independence Hall, in the city of Philadelphia, substantially as described, and shown in accompanying illustrations.
