

DESIGN FOR CHILD'S CARRIAGE.

Specification forming part of Design No. 9.135, dated March 14, 1876; application filed March 1, 1876. [Term of Patent 7 years.]

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, ISAAC COLE, of the city of Newark, in the county of Essex and State of New Jersey, have originated and designed a new patent for Children's Carriages, or Perambulators, of which the following is a full, clear, and exact description, reference being had to the accompanying photographic illustration, making part of this specification, which represents the nature and character of my design.

The distinctive feature in my design is that portion of the body of the vehicle marked A, constituting the sides and back thereof, which forms, as will be observed, five sides of an octagon, the portion immediately beneath it being, as here illustrated, semicircular in form; this latter feature, however, is not an essential element in my design, and may be retained or omitted at pleasure. Other por-

tions of the vehicle are constructed in the ordinary manner, and painted, upholstered, and otherwise ornamented as the taste may suggest.

What I claim as my invention, and desire to secure by Letters Patent of the United States, is—

A design for a child's carriage, or perambulator, in which the back of the body and the sides contiguous thereto form a portion of an octagon, substantially as set forth and described.
