DESIGN FOR DRESS-TRIMMINGS.

Specification forming part of Design No. 9, 136, dated March 14, 1876; application filed February 9, 1876.

[Term of Patent 7 years.]

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, GILBERT H. PRINDLE, of Philadelphia, in the county of Philadelphia, and in the State of Pennsylvania, have invented a certain new and original Design for Dress-Trimming; and do hereby declare that the following is a full, clear, and exact description thereof, reference being had to the accompanying drawing, making a part of this specification, in which is shown in plan view my improved trimming.

The distinctive feature of my design con-

The distinctive feature of my design consists of one row of balls, A and A, which are formed upon or of one continuous roving and row of fringe or tassels, B and B, that are secured to and depend from one side of said balls.

Another feature of my design consists of a series of loops, C and C, which are secured to and extend outward from one side of the balls A and A, and are connected together mid-

way between their ends and said balls by means of a roving, c.

The tassels B and B or loops C and C may be omitted from the design, if desired.

Having thus fully described my invention, what I claim as new is—

1. The design for trimming for garments, consisting of the balls Λ and Λ , loops C and C, and connecting roving c, substantially as described.

2. The design for trimming for garments, consisting of the balls A and A, fringe or tassels B and B, loops C and C, and connecting roving c, substantially as described.
