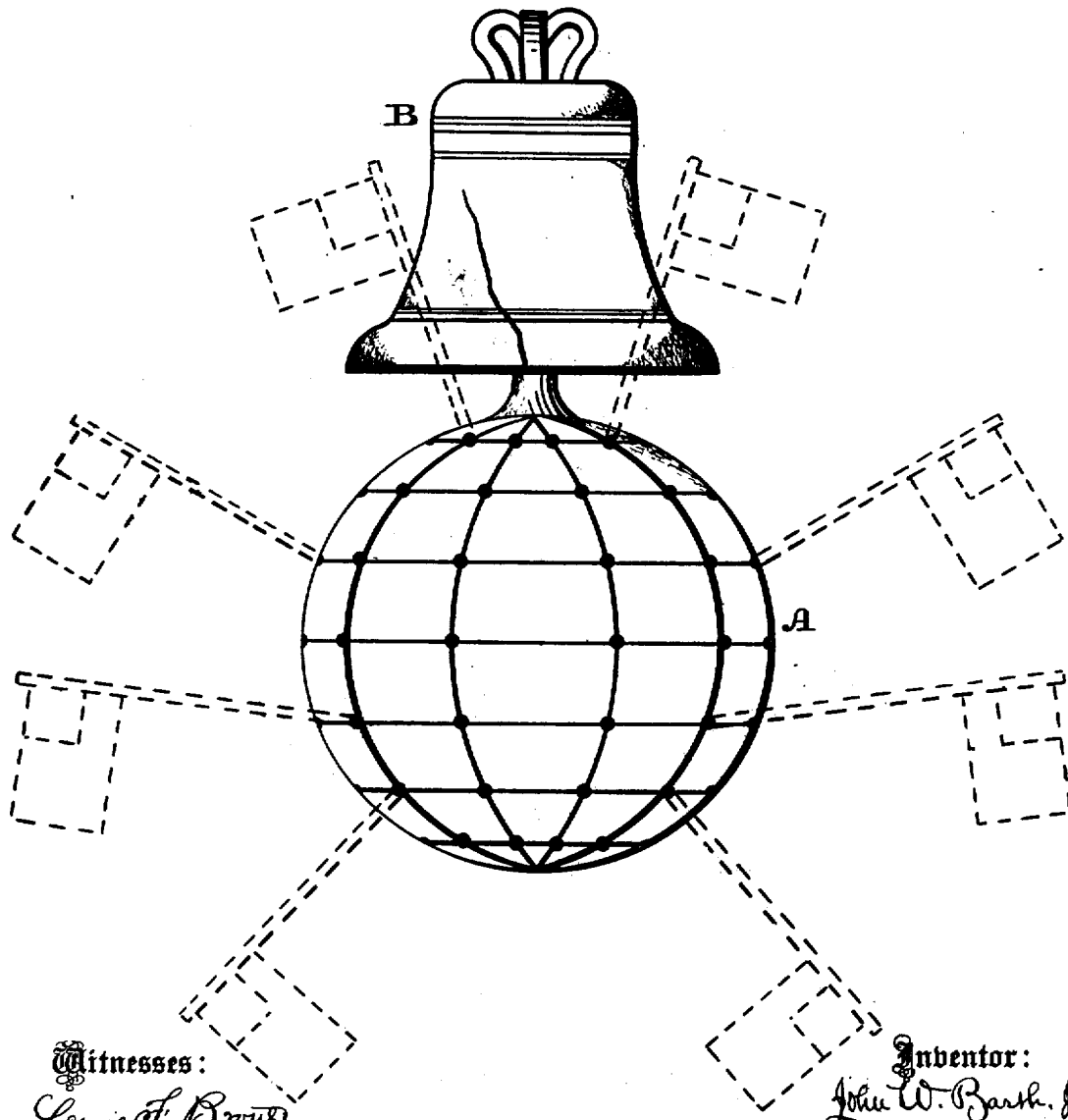

DESIGN FOR FLAG-HOLDERS.

Specification forming part of Design No. **9,137**, dated March 14, 1876; application filed March 2, 1876.
[Term of Patent 3½ years.]

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, JOHN W. BARTH, Jr., of the city and county of Philadelphia, and State of Pennsylvania, have originated and designed a new and useful Design for Flag-Holder and Ornament, of which the following is a full, clear, and exact description, reference being had to the accompanying drawing, making part of this specification, in which—

A represents a globe, and B a surmounted bell.

The holder may be suspended from the place to be decorated or attached to a flag-staff, and it will present a beautiful and suggestive design.

What I claim as my invention is—

The design for flag-holder and ornament, the same consisting of the globe A and surmounted bell B, as shown and set forth.
