

## DESIGN FOR CHINESE LANTERN.

Specification forming part of Design No. 9,139, dated March 14, 1876; application filed February 25, 1876. [Term of Patent 3½ years.]

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, John H. De Barry, of Philadelphia, in the county of Philadelphia and State of Pennsylvania, have invented a certain new and useful Design for Chinese Lantern; and I do hereby declare the following to be a full, clear, and exact description of the invention, such as will enable others skilled in the art to which it pertains to make and use it, reference being had to the accompanying drawing, which forms part of this specification, and which is a perspective of my design.

The object of my invention is to provide an crnamental lantern of the class known as "Chinese lanterns," (which are usually made of paper, and employed for decorative illumination purposes,) which shall be peculiarly appropriate for Centennial purposes.

My design accordingly consists of a lantern of the class described, made in the shape of or bearing a similitude to Old Liberty Bell in the State-House or Independence Hall, in the city of Philadelphia, Pennsylvania.

Referring to the accompanying drawing, A A designate the pasteboard strips, and B B

the intermediate corrugated paper pieces, which form the body, and which are shaped to resemble a bell, as shown; but, as my design is independent of mechanical construction, the entire body may be made of paper, either plain or fluted. C shows a bottom sustaining a candle or other light, and D a crown or yoke, beneath which is a draft-opening, d. By preference the lantern-body should have a representation of a fissure, as at a, and the inscription at b, either alone or accompanied by the figures "1776, 1876."

l claim—

The design for a Chinese lantern, having a bottom to hold a candle and a ventilation-opening, consisting of a transparent body, having the shape and configuration of the Old Liberty Bell, substantially as shown and described.
