

## DESIGN FOR INKSTANDS AND PEN-RACKS.

Specification forming part of Design No. 9.141, dated March 14, 1876; application filed February 16, 1876.

[Term of Patent 7 years.]

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, OTTO F. FOGELSTRAND, of Kensington, in the county of Hartford and State of Connecticut, have invented and produced a new and original design for an Inkstand and Pen-Rack, of which the following is a specification:

The nature of my design is fully represented in the accompanying engraving, to which reference is made.

A represents the base, the plan contour of which is octagonal. From each of the four short sides there extends downward a rounded projection or leg. The sides of this base are flaring, and are surrounded by a raised border. The raised border upon the lower side of the base has upward-projecting points formed by curved lines, each point terminating in a triplet of circular ornaments. The space unoccupied by said border and ornaments is a roughened depressed ground. The top of the base has a depression, in which is the ink-receptacle B, and the parts surrounding said receptacle are bor-

dered by a raised ledge, inside of which are raised ornaments composed of straight and curved bars. The pen-supporting arms CC project upward from the rear of the base A, the bodies of which arms are curved bars with a raised border on each edge, the interior space being ornamented with raised scroll-work and leaflets, part of which scroll-work extends above the upper edge of said arms, as shown. Upon the under side of the arms there are skeleton scroll-braces, as shown.

I claim as my invention-

The design for an inkstand and pen-rack, composed of the octagonal base A, having flaring sides, ornamented by upward-projecting points tipped with triplet circular figures, and arms CC, ornamented by a raised border, inside of which are raised scroll-work and leaflets, in the manner shown and described.
