

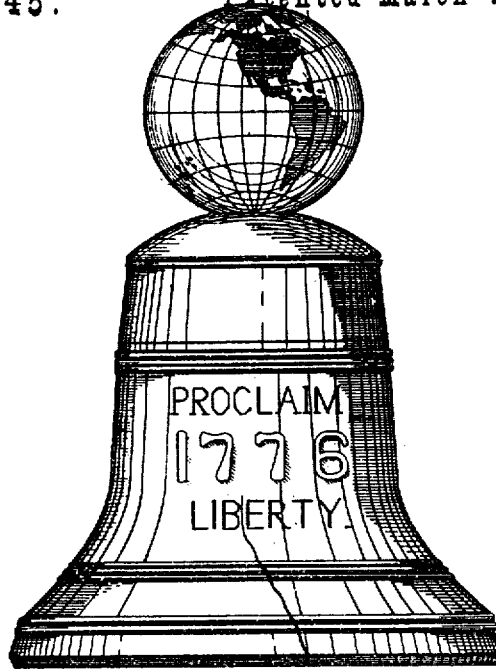

DESIGN FOR GLASS ARTICLES.

Specification forming part of Design No. 9,145, dated March 21, 1876; application filed February 17, 1876.
[Term of Patent 7 years.]

To all whom it may concern :

Be it known that I, BENJAMIN BAKEWELL, Jr., of Pittsburg, in the county of Allegheny and State of Pennsylvania, have invented a new and useful Improvement in Design for Glass Articles; and I do hereby declare the following to be a full, clear, and exact description thereof, reference being had to the accompanying drawing, illustrating my design.

My design is intended to be applied to glass articles generally; and it consists in giving to the article the shape or configuration of a bell surmounted by a globe.

I have illustrated my design applied to a covered article of glassware, in which the sound-bow forms the base, the barrel corresponds to the bowl, and the shoulders form the cover. Resting upon the shoulders of the

bell is a globe, with outlines of the continents, and upon the barrel the words "Proclaim Liberty" and the figures "1776" beneath the representation of the western hemisphere, and "Peace and Good Will" and the figures "1876" beneath the representation of the eastern hemisphere.

Having thus described my invention, I claim—

As a design for glass-articles, the shape or configuration of a bell surmounted by a globe, as shown.
