DESIGN FOR AN UMBRELLA-FRAME.

Specification forming part of Design No. 9,147, dated March 21, 1876; application filed March 10, 1876.

[Term of Patent 14 years.]

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, ABRAHAM HIRSH, of the city and county of St. Louis, and State of Missouri, have originated a new Design for Umbrella for Vehicles, of which the following is a full, clear, and exact description, reference being had to the accompanying photograhic illustration, making part of this specification.

The nature of my design is fully represented in the accompanying photographic illustration, to which reference is made, said photograph showing the under side of the umbrella.

The cloth a is stretched on ribs b b b b c c,

and the top, consisting of such ribs and cloth or cover, is of the form of an elongated hexagon, the four ribs b b b having each greater length than either of the two side ribs c c, and imparting to said top the described form.

I claim-

The design for an umbrella-frame having the form of an elongated hexagon, as described, and shown in the accompanying illustration.
