DESIGN FOR A BADGE.

Specification forming part of Design No. **9,148**, dated March 21, 1876; application filed February 24, 1876.
[Term of Patent $3\frac{1}{2}$ years.]

To all whom it may concern :

Be it known that I, HENRY NEWELL, of the city and county of Philadelphia, and State of Pennsylvania, have originated and designed a new and useful Design for Badge, of which the following is a full, clear, and exact description, reference being had to the accompanying photographic illustration.

The body of the badge is in the form of a rosette, on whose face is a spangled bell, having a base, on which are the words "Proclaim Liberty," and the figures "1776," "1876."

What I claim as my invention is—

The design for a badge, consisting of a rosette on whose face is a spangled bell, having a base, with the words "Proclaim Liberty," and the figures "1776," "1876," as set forth, and shown in the accompanying drawings.
