DESIGN FOR A BADGE.

Specification forming part of Design No. **9,150**, dated March 21, 1876; application filed March 11, 1876.
[Term of Patent 3½ years.]

To all whom it may concern :

Be it known that I, EMMA M. REQUA, of New York, in the county of New York and State of New York, have invented and produced a new Design for Decorative Badges; and I do hereby declare the following to be a full, clear, and exact description thereof, reference being had to the accompanying photograph, making part of this specification.

My invention relates to the production of a design in the manufacture of decorative badges, composed of a typical representation of the American eagle, with its wings as in flight, bearing in its beak a pendant on which is suspended a bell, preferably of the configuration of the Old Liberty Bell in Independence Hall, Philadelphia, the bell bearing on one side the

inscription "Independence," and on the other side "1776-1876."

What I claim as new, and for which I seek Letters Patent, is—

The design for a decorative badge, substantially as described, composed of a typical representation of the American eagle, with its wings as in flight, bearing in its beak a pendant on which is suspended a bell, as set forth, and shown in the accompanying drawing.
