

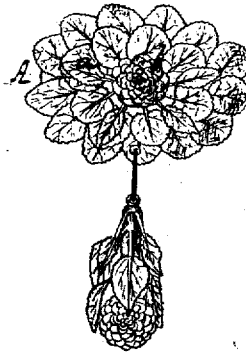

DESIGN FOR A BREASTPIN.

Specification forming part of Design No. **9,154**, dated March 21, 1876; application filed March 3, 1876.
[Term of Patent 3½ years.]

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, LEONARD S. BEALS, of Astoria, in the county of Queens and State of New York, have originated and designed a Pattern for Breastpins, of which the following is a full, clear, and exact description, reference being had to the accompanying photographic illustration or drawing, making part of this specification.

The nature of my design is fully illustrated in the accompanying drawing, to which reference is made, and which represents a face view of my breastpin. This design consists in a centifolious rose resting upon a cushion of leaves.

In the drawing, the letter A designates my breastpin, which consists of a cushion, *a*, of leaves, supporting the centifolious rose *b*.

What I claim as new, and desire to secure by Letters Patent, is—

The design for a breastpin, consisting of a cushion, *a*, of leaves, supporting a centifolious rose, *b*, as shown and described.
