DESIGN FOR A BREASTPIN.

Specification forming part of Design No. 9,155, dated March 21, 1876; application filed March 3, 1876.

[Term of Patent 34 years.]

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, LEONARD S. BEALS, of Astoria, in the county of Queens and State of New York, have originated a new Design for Breastpins, of which the following is a full, clear, and exact description, reference being had to the accompanying drawing, making part of this specification.

The nature of my design is fully represented in the accompanying drawing, which repre-

sents a face view of my breastpin.

This design consists in a series of leaves, the stems of which radiate from a common center, with a rose-bud occupying the center, and other rose buds interspersed between the leaves.

In the drawing, the letter A designates my breastpin, which is composed of a series of leaves, a, the stems of which radiate from a

common center. In this center is a rose-bud, b, and between the leaves appear different roses c.

What I claim as new, and desire to secure

by Letters Patent, is—

The design for a breastpin, consisting of a series of leaves, a, the stems of which radiate from a common center, a rose-bud, b, occupying said center, and the several roses c interspersed between the leaves, all as shown and described.
