DESIGN FOR A BREASTPIN.

Specification forming part of Design No. **9,156**, dated March 21, 1876; application filed March 3, 1876.

[Term of Patent $3\frac{1}{2}$ years.]

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, LEONARD S. BEALS, of Astoria, in the county of Queens and State of New York, have originated a new Design for Breastpins, of which the following is a full, clear, and exact description, reference being had to the accompanying drawing, making part of this specification.

The drawing represents a face view of this design.

This design consists in the bud of a moss-rose rising from the center of a cup, which is formed by a series of rose-leaves, and supported on a cushion of leaves.

In the drawing, the letter A designates my breastpin, which is ornamented by the bud a

of a moss-rose occupying the center of a cup *b*, formed by a series of leaves. Said cup and bud are supported by a cushion, *c*, of leaves.

What I claim as new, and desire to secure by Letters Patent, is—

The design for a breastpin, composed of the bud *a*, cup *b*, and cushion *c*, as shown and described.
