DESIGN FOR A BREASTPIN.

Specification forming part of Design No. 9,157, dated March 21, 1876; application filed March 3, 1876.

[Term of Patent 3½ years.]

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, LEONARD S. BEALS, of Astoria, in the county of Queens and State of New York, have originated a new Design for Breastpins, of which the following is a full, clear, and exact description, reference being had to the accompanying drawing, making a part of this specification.

The drawing represents a face view of my

design.

This design consists in a cluster of forgetme-nots supported by a cushion of leaves.

In the drawing, the letter A designates my breastpin, which is ornamented by a cluster,

a, of forget-me-nots, resting upon a cushion, b, of leaves.

What I claim as new, and desire to secure

by Letters Patent, is—
The design for a breastpin, consisting of a cluster, a, of forget-me-nots, and a cushion, b, of leaves, as shown and described.
