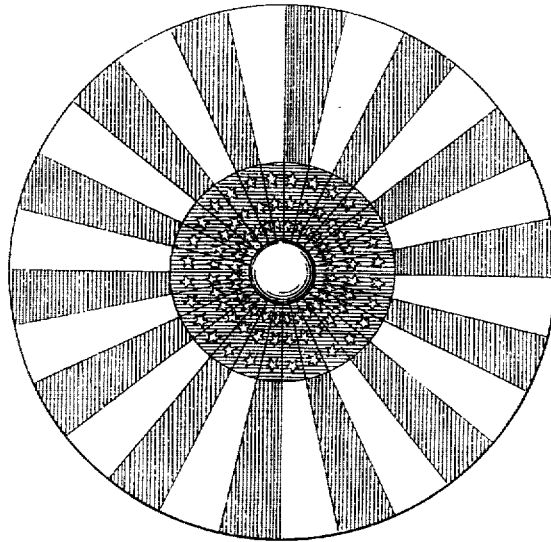
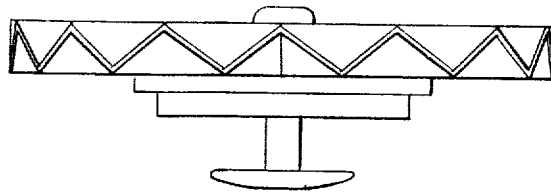

DESIGN FOR ROSETTES.

Specification forming part of Design No. **9,159**, dated March 21, 1876; application filed March 3, 1876.
[Term of Patent 7 years.]

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, JAMES C. REED, formerly of Boston, Massachusetts, but now of the city, county, and State of New York, have invented an Improved Design for a Rosette; and I do hereby declare that the following is a full, clear, and exact description thereof:

My design consists of the American national colors arranged so that their stars are presented on their blue ground in the center of the rosette with the red and white stripes radiating therefrom.

The accompanying drawing represents a rosette of my improved design, Figure 1 being a face view, and Fig. 2 an edge view.

The blue central portion of the rosette is represented in Fig. 1 by a tint in horizontal lines, with the stars in white. The red stripes

are represented by a tint in vertical lines, and the white stripes by intervening white spaces, all of said stripes radiating from the blue central portion. The rosette is crimped or corrugated radially. The crimping or corrugation is shown in profile in the edge view, Fig. 2.

I claim as my invention—

A design for a rosette representing the American national colors arranged so that the stars are presented on their blue ground in the center of the rosette, with the red and white stripes radiating therefrom, substantially as herein shown and described.
