DESIGN FOR EMBROIDERY.

Specification forming part of Design No. 9,163, dated March 28, 1876; application filed March 16, 1876.

[Term of Patent 3½ years.]

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, EMIL CRISAND, of New Haven, in the county of New Haven and State of Connecticut, have invented a new Design for Embroidery Pattern; and I do hereby declare the following, when taken in connection with the accompanying drawings, to be a full, clear, and exact description of the same, and which said drawings constitute part of this specification, and represent a face view.

This invention relates to a design for embroidery-pattern, with special reference to perforated board, the object being to indicate on the surface of the board the stitches which are to be taken in producing the pattern; and the design consists in the peculiar form and configuration of the letters of the motto, as shown in the accompanying illustration, and hereinafter described.

The motto which constitutes the base of this design is, "God Bless our Home." These words are arranged one above another, forming what is termed a panel-pattern. A tracery or vine of morning-glories runs through the motto; but the chief characteristic of the design is the capitals.

I claim—

The design for embroidery-pattern, consisting of the motto "God Bless our Home," in form as shown in the accompanying illustration.
