

DESIGN FOR CLOCK-CASES.

Specification forming part of Design No. 9,165, dated March 28, 1876; application filed January 15, 1876.

[Term of Patent 3½ years.]

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, EDWIN J. FARNUM, of Sing Sing, in the county of Westchester and State of New York, have invented a certain new and useful Design for Clocks and Clock Cases; and I do hereby declare the following to be a full, clear, and exact description of the invention, such as will enable others skilled in the art to which it pertains to make and use it, reference being had to the accompanying drawing, which forms a part of this specification, and is a side elevation of my design.

My design is especially devised with a view to providing a clock-case commemorative of the Centennial of the United States.

In the accompanying drawing illustrating my design, A is the body of the clock or clockcase, made in the shape of Old Liberty Bell in the State House at Philadelphia, Pennsyl-

vania, having a representation of the crack in said bell at a, and the inscription "Proclaim liberty throughout all the land unto all the inhabitants thereof" at b. The body of the case is surmounted by the Bird of Freedom, or eagle, shown at c.

What I claim is-

The design, herein described and shown, for clocks, consisting of the bell-shaped case A, provided with a time-dial, and surmounted by an eagle, c.
