

DESIGN FOR SHAWLS.

Specification forming part of Design No. 9,170, dated March 28, 1876; application filed January 17, 1876.

[Term of Patent 3½ years.]

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, EDWARD G. ANDRAE, of the city and county of Philadelphia, State of Pennsylvania, have originated and designed a Pattern for Shawls or other Fabrics, of which the following is a full, clear, and exact description, reference being had to the accompanying drawing, making a part of this specification.

The nature of my design is fully represented

in the accompanying drawing.

My pattern for a shawl represents bars or stripes at right angles to one another, having the appearance of being interlaced, forming squares similar to plaid or checkered work. In some squares the warp and filling are equally distributed and show equally on the surface. In some the warp-threads predomi-

nate, and in others the filling, while others again are composed entirely of filling, thus producing a variegated effect.

In my design I have used white and blue threads; but I do not consider the colors selected to be an essential element in the design, as other plain or fancy colors may be employed.

What I claim as my invention is—

A design for a shawl composed of bars or stripes at right angles to one another, having the appearance of being interlaced to form squares which are variegated in appearance, substantially as specified.
