

DESIGN FOR FLAG-HOLDER.

Specification forming part of Design No. 9, 171, dated March 28, 1876; application filed March 3, 1876. [Term of Patent 31 years.]

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, ELIJAH CUNDEY, of Philadelphia, in the county of Philadelphia and State of Pennsylvania, have invented a certain new and useful Design for Flag-Holder; and I do hereby declare the following to be a full, clear, and exact description of the invention, such as will enable others skilled in the art to which it pertains to make and use it, reference being had to the accompanying drawing, which forms part of this specification, and which is an elevation of my design.

My design has for its object to provide a flag-holder that shall have a special reference

to the Centennial of 1876.

My design for a flag-holder accordingly consists in making the same after the model or shaped like Old Liberty Bell in the State House, or Independence Hall, at Philadelphia, Pennsylvania.

In the accompanying drawing, A designates a block shaped like a bell. C represents a mock tongue, which, however, is not a necessary part of the design. D represents a counterfeit crack in similitude of the real fissure in Old Liberty Bell.

I claim-

The design for a flag holder, consisting of the bell-shaped block and the flags, arranged substantially as described and shown.
