

DESIGN FOR CIGAR.

Specification forming part of Design No. 9,172, dated March 28, 1876; application filed March 7, 1876. [Term of Patent 7 years.]

To all whom it may concern:

Beit known that I, FREDRICK GEILHAUSEN, of Red Oak, Montgomery county, in the State of Iowa, have invented a Design for Cigars, of which the following is a full, clear, and exact description, reference being had to the accompanying photographic illustration, forming part of this specification.

The nature of my design is fully represented in the accompanying photographic illustration, to which reference is made.

The under side a of the cigar is made with a continuous curve from end to end, and is convex throughout. The upper side of the cigar is made with its central portion b flattened, and with the surface at either end con-

vex, as shown at c and d, respectively, thus making the lighting end e cylindrical, or nearly so, while the mouth end f is pointed, and is thus in the form of a cone. Upon the flat surface b of the central portion of the upper side of the cigar any desired lettering or ornamentation may be impressed or embossed, although I do not consider this to be an essential element in my design.

What I claim as my invention is—

The design for a cigar, herein shown and described.
