

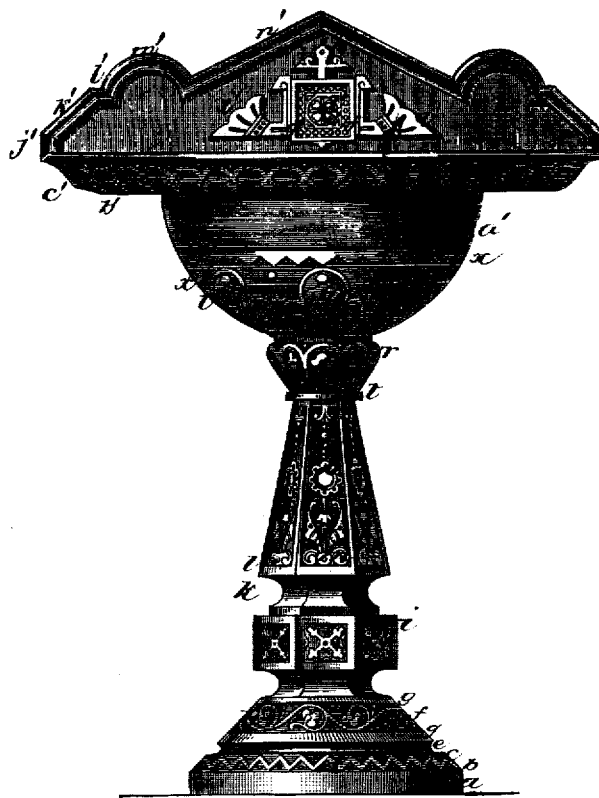

WILLIAM TWEEDDALE, OF BROOKLYN, NEW YORK.

DESIGN FOR WASH-BASIN.

Specification forming part of Design No. **9,173**, dated March 28, 1876; application filed March 21, 1876.

[Term of Patent 14 years.]

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, WILLIAM TWEEDDALE, of Brooklyn, in the county of Kings and State of New York, have invented a new and original Design for Wash-Basins, of which the following is a specification:

My design is fully represented in the accompanying engraving, to which reference is made.

The base commences with a plain cylindrical post, *a*, above which is a conical section, *b*, ornamented with the raised zigzag line *c* and points *d*; next is a plate, *e*, above which is a conical section, *f*, with plain bands *g* and vine figures *h*; next is a section with plain sides, ornamented with plain bands *i* and a star, *j*, said section being divided off from the base and the upright portion above by the deep transverse plates *k*. The upright portion above the upper flute *k* is plain sided, and tapering from the bottom upward, the sides being ornamented with the plain borders *l*, scrolls *m*, upright ornaments *n*, center figures *o*, beads *p*, and the pendants *q*. The top of the column has an enlarged head, ornamented with arch-shaped figures *r*, surrounding an upright figure, *s*, and at the top and bottom of the head is a plain band, *t*. The basin is figured on the bottom with the uprights *u*, arches *v*, scrolls *w*, lines *x*, and points *y*. The upper portion *a'* of the basin is plain, and the plate on the top has an ogee outline, ornamented with the arches *b'* and points *c'*. The back plate is ornamented with the shield *d'*, having a central circular figure, *e'*, inclined in a square of points, *f'*, and a plain border, *g'*. The shield is surmounted by a cross, *h'*, and on each side it has an ornamental figure, *i'*. The top of

the back is finished with a bead-molding, fitted in vertical sections *j'*, inclines *k'*, horizontals *l'*, arches *m'*, and inclines *n'*.

I claim, as a design for the base of a wash-basin—

1. The plain section *a*, conical section *b*, line *c*, points *d*, flute *e*, as set forth.

2. The conical section *f*, ornamented with the plain bands *g'* and vine representations *h*, as set forth.

3. As a design for the column of a wash-basin, the plain-sided section, banded above and below by the transverse flutes *k*, and ornamented with the plain borders *i* and star *j*, as set forth.

4. The taper plain-sided section, ornamented with the plain borders *l*, scrolls *m*, upright figures *n*, center figures *o*, beads *p*, and pendants *q*, as set forth.

5. As a design for the head of the column of a wash-basin, the arch-shaped figures *r*, upright ornamental figures *s*, and plain bands *t*, as set forth.

6. As a design for a wash-basin, the upright figures *u*, arches *v*, scrolls *w*, lines *x*, and points *y*, as set forth.

7. As a design for the top of a wash-basin, the ogee outline ornamented with arches *b'* and points *c'*, as set forth.

8. As a design for the back plate of a wash-stand, the shield *d'*, with center-piece *e*, point border *f'*, plain border *g'*, cross *h'*, and the lateral figures *i'*, as set forth.
