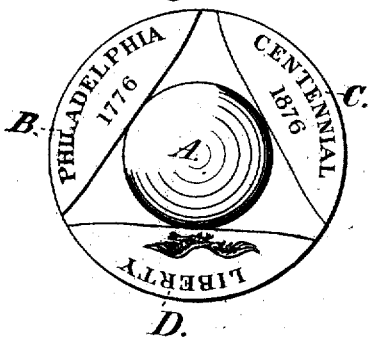

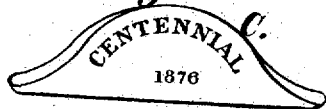

DESIGN FOR ORNAMENTAL BUTTONS.

Specification forming part of Design No. **9,176**, dated April 4, 1876; application filed December 30, 1875.
[Term of Patent $3\frac{1}{4}$ years.]

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that we, NATHANIEL H. FURNESS, of Tarrytown, New York State, and SIGOURNEY WALES, of New York city and State, have invented a Design for Buttons, of which the following is a specification:

The nature of our invention is fully represented in the accompanying drawing, to which reference is made.

Figure 1: A represents a button in the form of the old Continental or three-cornered hat, with the flap B, having thereon the legend "Philadelphia, 1776;" the flap C, the legend "Centennial, 1876;" the flap D, the legend "Liberty," and an eagle beneath it.

We prefer to make the ornament of sheet metal, but we do not confine ourselves to that material.

What we claim as our invention is—

1. The design for a button, consisting in the form of a three-cornered hat with turned-up flaps, in representation of the old Continental hat, substantially as described, and shown in the accompanying illustration.

2. The design for a button, consisting of the three-cornered hat, having the eagle and mottoes on the flaps, substantially as described and shown.
