

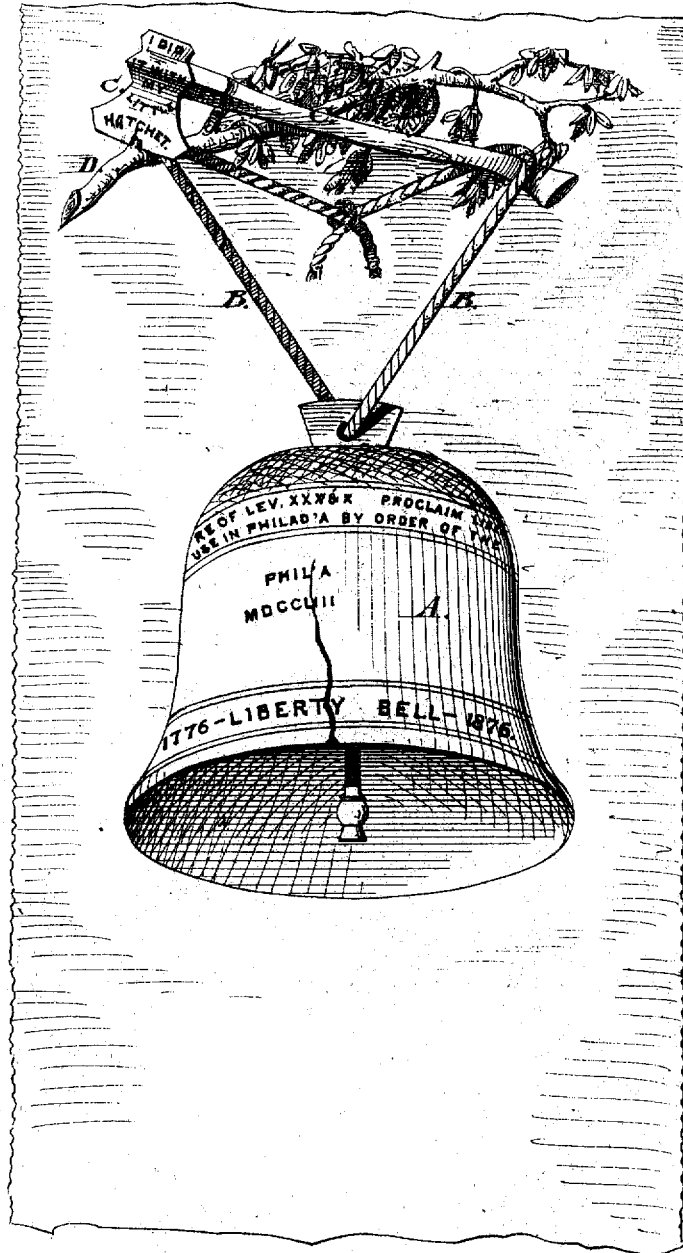

DESIGN FOR A BADGE.

Specification forming part of Design No. **9,178**, dated April 4, 1876; application filed March 23, 1876.
[Term of Patent 3½ years.]

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, JAMES D. LYON, of Grand Rapids, State of Michigan, have originated a new Design for Badges and other similar articles, of which the following is a full, clear, and exact description, reference being had to the accompanying drawing, making part of this specification.

The nature of my design is fully represented in the accompanying drawing, to which reference is made.

A represents a fac-simile of the Liberty Bell of 1776, having upon it the same identical inscription; B, a cord, from which the bell is hung; C, a hatchet and handle, the hatchet having upon it the inscription, "I did it with my little hatchet;" D, a cherry-limb and leaves—the outline of hatchet and handle,

cherry-limb and leaves, rope and bell to be printed in silver bronze, (white;) inscription and shadings to be printed in bright scarlet ink; the design to be printed on blue ribbon.

I do not wish to confine myself to the precise arrangement as shown, as it may be varied in minor particulars, nor to the different colors, as they also can be varied.

What I claim as my invention is—

The design for a badge composed, essentially, of the bell B, hatchet and handle C, and cherry-limb and leaves D, substantially as described, and shown in the accompanying illustration.
