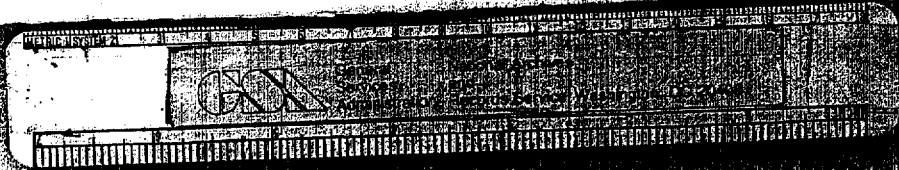

DESIGN FOR THE LOWER-CASE LETTERS OF A FONT OF SCRIPT PRINTING-TYPES.

Specification forming part of Design No. **9,187**, dated April 4, 1876; application filed March 25, 1876.
[Term of Patent 14 years.]

To all whom it may concern :

Be it known that I, DAVID WOLFE BRUCE, of the city and county of New York and State of New York, have originated and designed a new Design for the Lower-Case Letters of a Font of Script Printing-Types, of which the following is a specification :

The nature of my design is clearly shown in the accompanying typographic impression, to which reference is made; and consists of lower-case letters for a font of script printing-types, including logotypes and final letters, similar in general character to the designs for which Letters Patent Nos. 5,814 and 8,945 were issued to me, and has the sharp turns characteristic of those designs, but differs from them in weight of face, being heavier, and also

in being more condensed. It differs also from design for which Andrew Little was granted Letters Patent No. 8,485, in being of heavier weight of face, and because of the sharp turn made by the angle at which the hair-lines run into the body-marks, producing an entirely different effect.

What I claim as my invention, and desire to secure by Letters Patent, is—

The design or pattern for the lower-case letters of a font of script printing-types, as shown and described.
