

DESIGN FOR A STATUETTE.

Specification forming part of Design No. 9,188, dated April 4, 1876; application filed February 21, 1876.

[Term of Patent 7 years.]

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, RUDOLPH CHRISTESEN, of West Meriden, in the county of New Haven and State of Connecticut. have invented a new Design for Statuette; and I do hereby declare the following, when taken in connection with the accompanying drawings and the letters of reference marked thereon, to be a full, clear, and exact description of the same, and which said drawings constitute part of this specification, and represent a perspective view.

This invention relates to a design for combination statuette, the object being to represent the figure as before a mirror; and it consists in the combination of a mirror and the figure of a dog before it, all on the same base.

A is the base, on which is mounted a mirror, B, and in front of this a dog looking into the mirror.

I do not wish to limit myself to the precise figure shown, it only being essential to the design that there be a dog represented before and on the same base with the mirror.

I claim-

The design for a statuette, consisting of the mirror, dog, and base, as herein described, and shown in accompanying illustration.
