DESIGN FOR CARPETS.

Specification forming part of Design No. **9,193**, dated April 4, 1876; application filed March 27, 1876.
[Term of Patent $3\frac{1}{4}$ years.]

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, ALFRED HEALD, of Philadelphia, Pennsylvania, have produced or invented a Design for a Carpet-Pattern, of which the following is a specification:

My design for a carpet-pattern is fully shown in the accompanying photographic illustration.

The design is of a foliated character throughout, its main features being the two groups of fuchsias and leaves *a* and *b*, the intervening space or groundwork of the pattern being ornamented by leaves and branches, of a character too clearly shown to need description.

Irrespective of the colors employed, I claim—
The design for a carpet-pattern, substantially as described, and as shown in and by the accompanying drawing.
