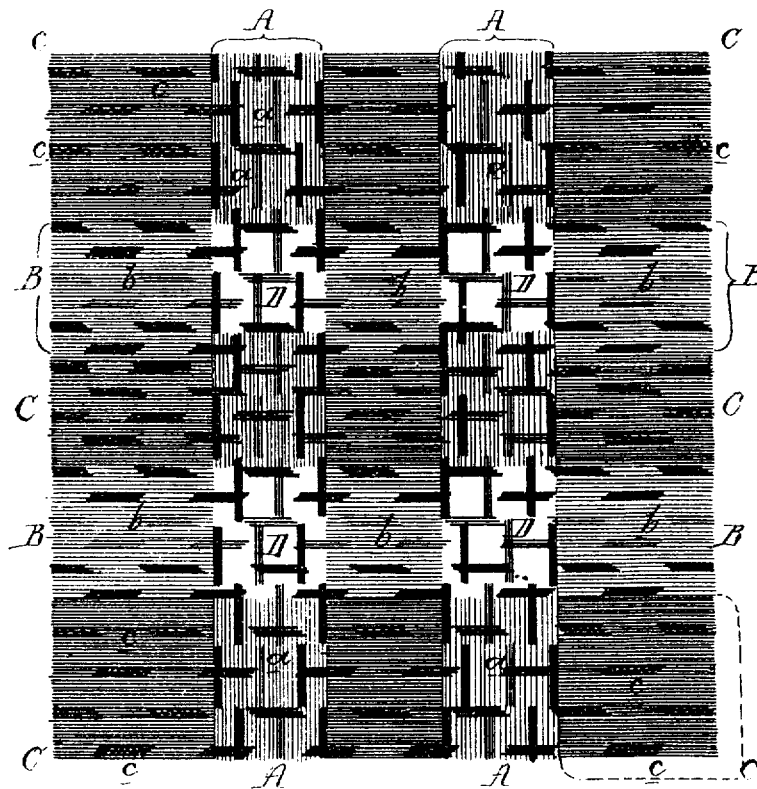

## DESIGN FOR SHAWL FABRICS.

Specification forming part of Design No. 9,200, dated April 4, 1876; application filed February 28, 1876.  
[Term of Patent 3½ years.]

*To all whom it may concern:*

Be it known that I, CHARLES H. LANDENBERGER, of Philadelphia, Pennsylvania, have invented a Design for a Shawl Fabric, of which the following is a specification:

My design for a shawl fabric is fully shown in the accompanying drawing.

The body C of the shawl is ornamented with oblong mottled spots *c*, and is crossed at right angles by stripes A and B, also ornamented with oblong spots *a* and *b*. The spots *c* of the body are continued across the stripes A, and at the junction of the stripes A and B a square figure is formed, which is crossed by the spots of both stripes.

Irrespective of the colors employed, I claim—  
1. The design for the stripes A and B with their oblong spots *a* and *b*, as shown and described.

2. The design for the whole pattern, comprising the body C, stripes A and B, and figure D.
