DESIGN FOR FONT OF PRINTING-TYPES.

Specification forming part of Design No. 9,201, dated April 4, 1876; application filed March 13, 1876.

[Term of Patent 7 years.]

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, ANDREW LITTLE, of the city, county, and State of New York, have invented and originated a new Design for a Font of Printing-Types, of which the following is a specification:

The nature of my design is clearly shown in the accompanying typographic impression, to which reference is made, and consists of a

sloping condensed letter.

In certain of the letters of the font, as in the letters A, G, and M, one of the lines forming the letter is extended below the bottom of the letter, and is slightly curved; in others of the letters, as in B, D, P, and R, the upper portion of one of the lines forming the letters is curved around and above the other line of the letters; in the letter U one of the lines of

the letter is extended above the top of the letter, and is slightly curved; and in the letter N, the lines forming the letter extend below the bottom and above the top, and are slightly curved.

The design now shown differs from the design patented by me in July, 1870, No. 4,203, in that it is more compressed, and the lines extended above and below are less curved.

Having now described my design, what I claim as new is—

The design for a font of printing-types, as shown.
