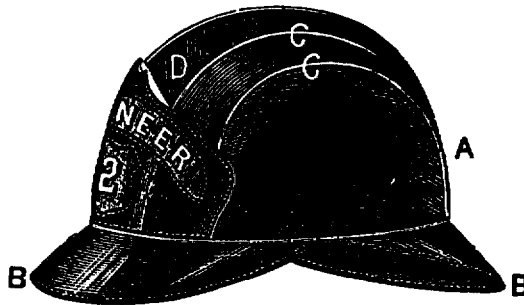

DESIGN FOR FIREMAN'S CAP.

Specification forming part of Design No. **9,205**, dated April 11, 1876; application filed January 24, 1876.
[Term of Patent 3½ years.]

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, FRED. J. MILLER, of Brooklyn, in the county of Kings and State of New York, have invented a Design for Firemen's Cap, of which the following is a specification:

The nature of my design is fully represented in the accompanying engraving, to which reference is made.

A represents the skull or body of cap; B B, the front and back visors; C C, the seams or welts which run from front to back. D is

a high welt or cone, which extends above the skull of cap.

What I claim as my invention is—

A design for a cap, having two visors, B B, welts C C, and high cone D, in the manner described and shown.
