DESIGN FOR BOTTLES.

Specification forming part of Design No. 9,206, dated April 11, 1876; application filed March 31, 1876.
[Term of Patent $3\frac{1}{2}$ years.]

To all whom it may concern :

Be it known that I, EDWARD NEWMAN, of the city and county of Philadelphia and State of Pennsylvania, have originated and designed a Bottle, of which the following is a full, clear, and exact description, reference being had to the accompanying photographic illustration, making part of this specification.

My design consists of a glass bottle, the body *a* of which is of the form of the bust of Washington. *b* represents a pedestal, on which the body *a* is mounted, and it constitutes the mouth and neck of the bottle.

At the base of the bust, as at *c*, there may be blown the word "Washington."

I claim as my invention—

The design for a bottle, the same consisting of the body *a*, of the form of the bust of Washington, and the mouth and neck of the form of a supporting-pedestal, *b*, as shown and described.
