DESIGN FOR BOTTLES.

Specification forming part of Design No.9,206, dated April 11, 1876; application filed March 31, 1876. [Term of Patent 31 years.]

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, EDWARD NEWMAN, of the city and county of Philadelphia and State of Pennsylvania, have originated and designed a Bottle, of which the following is a full, clear, and exact description, reference being had to the accompanying photographic illustration, making part of this specification.

My design consists of a glass bottle, the body a of which is of the form of the bust of Washington. b represents a pedestal, on which the body a is mounted, and it con stitutes the mouth and neck of the bottle.

At the base of the bust, as at c, there may be blown the word "Washington."

I claim as my invention-

The design for a bottle, the same consisting of the body a, of the form of the bust of Washington, and the mouth and neck of the form of a supporting-pedestal, b, as shown and described.
