

DESIGN FOR SHOW-CASES.

Specification forming part of Design No. 9.210, dated April 11, 1876; application filed March 27, 1876.

[Term of Patent 7 years.]

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, JOSEPH LEHNBEUTER, of the city and county of St. Louis and State of Missouri, have originated a new Design for Show-Cases, of which the following is a full, clear, and exact description, reference being had to the accompanying drawing, making part of this specification.

The nature of my design is fully represented in the accompanying drawing, to which reference is made. The show case has vertical frame-bars A, horizontal frame-bars B, and inclined frame-bars C, the frame supporting the transparent panes, as usual. My case has a central portion, D, whose flat top d extends from rear to front of the case, and whose front d' is vertical. The case has end portions E E

extending above the level of the part D, and made to extend from the back of the case some distance (only) toward the front. F F are inclined faces which extend upward from the bottom G to the front walls s s of the portions E E. These faces F F are made flat, as shown. The tops e' e' of the portions E E may be made opaque or transparent.

I claim-

The design for a show-case, having the flat central part D, elevated parts E E extending a portion of the depth of the case, and inclined flat faces F F, substantially as set forth.
