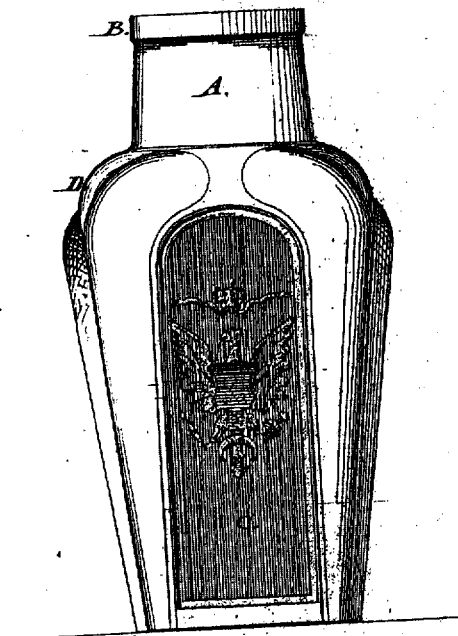
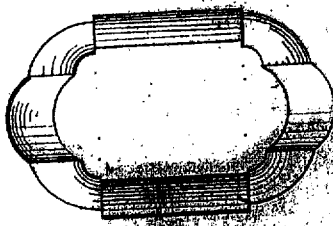

DESIGN FOR GLASS BOTTLE OR JAR.

Specification forming part of Design No. 9,212, dated April 11, 1876; application filed April 6, 1876.
[Term of Patent 3½ years.]

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, CHARLES K. SHERWOOD, of the city, county, and State of New York, have originated and designed a Glass Bottle or Jar for Pickles, of which the following is a full, clear, and exact description, reference being had to the accompanying drawing, forming a part of this specification, in which—

Figure 1 is a side elevation. Fig. 2 is a plan view, looking from the bottom.

The nature of my design is fully shown in the drawing, which is lettered in its various parts.

The bottle or jar has a narrow base, with an oblong section, as shown in Fig. 2, and increases in capacity and size upward toward

the neck, where it is gathered in. The neck A diminishes upward, forming the frustum of a cone, and is capped with a projecting band, B. A recessed panel, C, which is rectangular at its base, rises and is finished with the segment of an ellipse. A V-shaped molding surrounds it. The largest part of the jar D curves into the base of the neck and has the horizontal outline, as shown in Fig. 2 of the drawing.

What I claim as my invention is—

The bottle or jar having the general contour, panels, and the neck as described.
