

## DESIGN FOR SALVERS.

Specification forming part of Design No. 9,213, dated April 11, 1876; application filed January C5, 1876. [Term of Patent 7 years.]

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, AUGUSTUS CONRADT, of Middletown, county of Middlesex and State of Connecticut, have originated a new Design for Salvers, of which the following is a clear, full, and exact description, reference being had to the accompanying photographic illustra-tion, making part of this specification.

The nature of my design is fully represented in the accompanying photographic illustration,

to which reference is made.

The salver is given the general form of a semicircle, as shown, the edge a being constituted of the arc of the semicircle. The edge b, which is the chord of the arc, or the diameter of the circle of which the edge a is the half, may be curved inward at c, as shown, while the corners d, where the edge a joins the edge

b, may be curved inward in the form of arcs of smaller circles, as shown.

The salver may be ornamented, as shown in the illustration, or with any other desirable engraving or pattern, and it is preferably provided with handles, as shown; but I do not consider the engraved pattern or the handles as essential to my design shown. What I claim as my invention is-

A design for a salver shown, consisting of the semicircular side a a, the back c, slightly concave, and the sharply-concaved corners dd, substantially as shown.
