

DESIGN FOR ORGAN-CASES.

Specification forming part of Design No. 9,215, dated April 11, 1876; application filed March 2, 1876.

[Term of Patent 14 years.]

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, JOHN R. LOMAS, of New Haven, in the county of New Haven and State of Connecticut, have invented a new Design for Organ Case; and I do hereby declare the following, when taken in connection with the accompanying drawings, to be a full, clear, and exact description of the same, and which said drawings constitute part of this specification, and represent a perspective view.

This invention relates to a design for organcases specially adapted to reed-organs and like musical instruments; and it consists in the peculiar configuration of the case, as shown in the accompanying illustration, and hereinafter described.

The section A below the key board section B is less in dimensions than the key board section. This lower section consists of a series of posts extending from the base C to the key-section B, with a corbel, D, at the top to represent a support for the key-board section. Above the key-board section a third section,

E, is arranged, which forms the cover. This section in its closed position is rectangular in form, but when open gives an incline to the book-rack, this part of the design being in the square or rectangular form of the upper section.

I claim—

1. The design for an organ-case, consisting of the lower section A of smaller dimensions than the second or key-board section B, with posts extending from the base C to and supporting the key-board section, as shown in the accompanying illustration.

2. The design for an organ-case, consisting in the recessed upper or cover section E of rectangular form exteriorly, and of smaller dimensions than the correspondingly-recessed key-board section B, as shown in the accompanying illustration.
