

## DESIGN FOR CHILD'S CARRIAGE.

Specification forming part of Design No. 9,219, dated April 18, 1876; application filed March 6, 1876. [Term of Patent 3½ years.]

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, GEORGE W. MARBLE, of Chicago, in the county of Qook and State of Illinois, have invented and originated a Design for a Baby-Carriage, of which the following is a full, clear, and exact description, reference being had to the accompanying photographic illustration, making part of this specification.

The nature of my design is fully represented in the accompanying photographic illustrations, which are front and rear perspective views of the carriage-body.

A represents a drop-foot bed, upon which is secured the woven-willow body B, of the

shape and configuration shown, finished at the edges by a wider woven band, a, of the same material. At the front end there is secured a dash, C.

What I claim as my invention is-

The design for a baby-carriage body, consisting of the drop-foot bed A, the woven-willow body B, woven band a, and the dash-board C, of the form substantially as represented.
